# Postgame Football Notes — San Diego State vs. Hawai'i Nov. 23, 2019 SDCCU Stadium | San Diego, Calif.

### **Big Notes**

- San Diego lost for the first time on the road this season, falling to 5-1 away from home.
- The Aztecs had their five-game road winning streak snapped.
- SDSU had its three-game winning streak against Hawai'i at Aloha Stadium snapped. San Diego State had won four straight at Aloha Stadium (also the 2015 Hawai'i Bowl against Cincinnati).
- San Diego State saw its seven-game winning streak snapped when playing with exactly eight days in between games (6-1 in Rocky Long era).
- San Diego State held Hawai'i to its fewest total yards (347) and passing yards (215) this season.

### **Team Notes**

- SDSU has still won 26 of its last 38 (26-12) games, 33 of its last 47 (33-14), 46 of its last 61 (46-15) and 47 of its last 65 since the 2015 season (47-18).
- The Aztecs dropped to 40-9 in the Rocky Long era when holding their opponent to an average field position of less the 25-yard line.
- SDSU fell to 24-3 since 1988 when owning at least a 14-yard advantage in field position (tonight: +14).
- The Aztecs fell to 31-2 over their last 33 games when owning a turnover advantage.
- SDSU fell to 51-6 in the Rocky Long era when committing less turnovers than its opponent.
- San Diego State dropped to 51-3 in the Rocky Long era when keeping its opponent to 17 or less points.
- SDSU fell to 67-8 in the Rocky Long era when holding its opponent to less than 24 points.

### **Series Notes**

- SDSU dropped to 20-11-2 all-time against Hawai'i.
- San Diego State had its three-game winning streak snapped vs. Hawai'i at Aloha Stadium.
- The Aztecs fell to 11-7-2 all-time against UH in Honolulu.
- Since Hawai'i joined the Mountain West in 2012, SDSU has won six of the eight meetings.

#### **Trends**

- San Diego State started with the ball for the 95th time in the last 108 games.
- The Aztecs allowed a touchdown on their opponents' opening drive of the game for just the third time this season. SDSU is 2-1 in those games.
- San Diego State allowed its opponent to score on its opening possession for just the third time this season and just the 18th time since 2015 (65 games).

### **Player Notes**

# \* Ryan Agnew, Sr., QB (25-for-39, 229 yds., 0 TD, 0 INT | 2 att., 8 yds., 1 TD)

- Was 25-for-39 for 229 yards.
- Also rushed twice for eight yards with a touchdown.
- The rushing touchdown was the first of his career in his 38th game played.
- Dropped to 14-4 as the team's starting quarterback.

# \* Parker Houston, Sr., TE (5 rec., 47 yds.)

• Had career highs of five catches and 47 yards.

### \* Lug Barcoo, Sr., CB (3 tackles, 1 INT, 1 PBU)

- Had three tackles, an interception and a pass breakup.
- Now has eight interceptions on the season and nine for his career.
- Ranks in a tie for first in the nation in interceptions and tied for second in SDSU single-season history.
- In SDSU's Division I history, he is tied for first with the eight interceptions.

## \* Darren Hall, So., CB (8 tackles, 1 PBU)

- Had eight tackles and a pass breakup.
- Led the team in tackles for the second time this season and third time of his career.

# \* Brandon Heicklen, Sr., P (5 punts, 208 yards (41.6 avg.), 5 120, 4 110)

- Punted five times for 208 yards (41.6 avg.) and a net average of 41.6.
- All five of his punts landed inside the 20-yard line, including four inside the 10 and two inside the 5.
- Off his five punts, Hawai'i started at the 8, 2, 7, 4 and 12 for an average start of 6.6-yard line.
- Only two of his punts were from SDSU's side of the ball, averaging 50.0 yards per punt.

#### Other Notes

- WAR Tariq Thompson started for the 37th consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- LB Troy Cassidy played in his 48th straight game, the longest streak on the team.
- Tonight's attendance was 24,911.
