STRADLING YOCCA CARLSON & RAUTH mandate and injunctive relief directed to Respondent and Defendant JOEL PABLO, in his official capacity as City Clerk and Election Official of the City of Lemon Grove ("Respondent" or the "City Clerk") and has identified Real Parties in Interest KENNETH KING, STEPHANIE KLEIN, JEREMY KING, RACHAEL KELLY, BONNIE WATSON, FELINA THOM, CLARK THOM, MARY NICHOLSON, ROSA CARNEY, AUBREE RUSSELL and DOES 1-100, who are the official proponents of the effort to recall Snow from her position as the Mayor of the City of Lemon Grove (collectively, "Real Parties"), and alleges as follows:

Petitioner ALYSSON SNOW ("Petitioner" or "Snow") hereby seeks a writ of

INTRODUCTION

- 2. Petitioner brings this action because Real Parties, in their capacities as the proponents of the efforts to recall Lemon Grove Mayor, Alysson Snow, have violated, and are continuing to violate, the California Elections Code by falsifying documents submitted to Respondent in support of Real Parties' recall efforts; judicial relief is required to protect the integrity of the recall process, provide for an informed electorate and prevent confusion of voters.
- 3. When Real Parties' months-long efforts to secure the signatures necessary to commence recall proceedings against Petitioner Snow proved unsuccessful, they opted to fraudulently deceive the voters of the City of Lemon Grove with a bait-and-switch scheme.
- 4. Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on or before May 17, 2025, Real Party in Interest Kenneth King ("King") and two other men formed a plan to prepare a false Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition regarding Snow ("False NOI"). The False NOI contained false statements regarding Mayor Snow and was presented to voters in the City of Lemon Grove in furtherance of their effort to recall Mayor Snow. After obtaining signatures on the False NOI, King and his conspirators removed the face page of the False NOI and submitted to Respondent a different Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition regarding Snow. This different Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition was not the version that the recall proponents read when they signed. King and his conspirators fraudulently appended the voters' signatures collected using the False NOI.

5. These fraudulent behaviors undermine the integrity of the recall process and a writ of mandate and injunction should issue to prevent further recall efforts premised upon the False NOI.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 6. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on April 15, 2025, King submitted the first Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition regarding Snow ("First NOI") to Respondent. A true and correct copy of the First NOI is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1.** The First NOI contained the following factually false statement:
 - "Alysson is now reportedly a part of a sprawling federal investigation into corruption in cannabis licensing a serious breach of public trust and further proof she should be recalled." (the "False Statement").
- 7. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on April 16, 2025 Respondent rejected the First NOI due to procedural defects. A true and correct copy of Respondent's email and letter rejecting the First NOI are attached hereto as **Exhibits 2 and 3**, **respectively.**
- 8. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that On April 29, 2025, King submitted a second Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition regarding Snow ("Second NOI") to Respondent. The Second NOI contained the False Statement. A true and correct copy of the Second NOI is attached hereto as **Exhibit 4.**
- 9. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on April 30, 2025 Respondent rejected the Second NOI due to procedural defects. A true and correct copy of Respondent's email and letter rejecting the Second NOI are attached hereto as **Exhibits 5 and 6**, **respectively.**

10. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on May 6 and 7, 2025, King submitted a third Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition regarding Snow ("Third NOI") to Respondent. The Third NOI contained the False Statement. True and correct copies of the Third NOI submitted on May 6 and 7, 2025 are attached collectively hereto as **Exhibit 7.**

- 11. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on May 8, 2025 Respondent rejected the Third NOI due to improper re-use of signatures collected for the First and/or Second NOI. A true and correct copy of Respondent's letter rejecting the Third NOI is attached hereto as **Exhibit 8.**
- 12. Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on or around May 17, 2025, at Lemon Grove Coffee, King met with at least two other individuals to discuss the recall of Petitioner Snow. One gentleman said that the homelessness issue was not a winning issue to remove the mayor from office. King then stated, together with another gentleman, that they intended to include a false allegation that Petitioner was involved in a federal investigation into fraudulent cannabis practices in the statement of reasons circulated for signatures.
- 13. Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on May 22, 2025, at or about 5:30 p.m., King was in the parking lot of the old 99 Cent Store collecting signatures on a Notice of Intention to Circulate a Petition to recall Snow. A witness observed King utilizing a clipboard to which multiple pages were clipped. The first page on the clipboard was titled: "EXHIBIT A NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CIRCULATE RECALL PETITION," and was followed by one or more pages with signature lines for registered voters' signatures (collectively, the "False NOI"). A true and correct photograph of the face page of the False NOI is attached hereto as **Exhibit 9.** At the time the photograph was taken, no one had yet signed any of the pages behind the False NOI on the clipboard.
 - 14. The False NOI included the False Statement.

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15. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on June 5, 2025, King submitted a Fourth Notice of Intention to Circulate Recall Petition regarding Snow ("Fourth NOI") to Respondent. A true and correct copy of the Fourth NOI is attached hereto as **Exhibit 10.** The Fourth NOI did not include the False Statement.

- 16. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on June 5, 2025 Respondent accepted the Fourth NOI. Exhibit 11.
- 17. A Notice of Intention to Recall Snow was published in The East County Californian newspaper on June 20, 2025 ("Published NOI"), after King's May 17, 2025 statements at Lemon Grove Coffee regarding his intended scheme to use the False NOI to obtain recall signatures, and King's May 22, 2025 signature gathering efforts in the 99 Cent Store parking using the False NOI. The Published NOI is materially different from the False NOI, as it omits the False Statement, among other differences. A true and correct copy of the Published NOI is attached hereto as Exhibit 12.
- 18. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on June 23, 2025, King submitted a form of Recall Petition to Respondent ("First Recall Petition") including the Statement of Grounds from the Fourth NOI. Exhibit 13.
- 19. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on July 1, 2025, Respondent rejected the First Recall Petition due to procedural defects. A true and correct copy of the July 1 Rejection Letter is attached hereto as **Exhibit 14.**
- 20. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on July 8, 2025, King submitted a second form of Recall Petition to Respondent ("Second Recall Petition") including the Statement of Grounds for Recall from the Fourth NOI. A true and correct copy of the Second Recall Petition is attached hereto as Exhibit 15.

- 21. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on July 17, 2025, Respondent rejected the Second Recall Petition due to procedural defects. A true and correct copy of the July 17 Rejection Letter is attached hereto as **Exhibit 16.**
- 22. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on July 28, 2025, King submitted a third form of Recall Petition to Respondent ("Third Recall Petition"), including the Statement of Grounds for Recall from the Fourth NOI. A true and correct copy of the Third Recall Petition is attached hereto as **Exhibit 17.** The Third Recall Petition does not include the False Statement.
- 23. Based upon records produced by Respondent in response to Petitioner's Public Records Request, Petitioner is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that on August 7, 2025, Respondent accepted the Third Recall Petition. A true and correct copy of the August 7 Acceptance Letter is attached hereto as **Exhibit 18.**

PARTIES TO THIS PROCEEDING

- 24. Petitioner Alysson Snow is the Mayor of the City of Lemon Grove and the target of Real Parties' recall efforts.
- 25. Respondent, Joel Pablo, is the City Clerk and Elections Official of the City of Lemon Grove. As such, Petitioner implements all statutory city clerk functions and serves as a neutral liaison between citizens and government by ensuring transparent processes. The City Clerk acts as a compliance officer for federal, state, and local statutes, including the Political Reform Act, Ralph M. Brown Act, and Public Records Act, and implements statutory city clerk functions, including preparing and disseminating City Council agendas and legislative proceedings, citywide records, public records requests, as well as maintaining the City's Municipal Code. Accordingly, Mr. Pablo has a public duty to strictly comply with the Elections Code and all other applicable laws, including but not limited to, the United States and California Constitutions.

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26. Petitioner is informed and believes Respondents KENNETH KING, STEPHANIE KLEIN, JEREMY KING, RACHAEL KELLY, BONNIE WATSON, FELINA THOM, CLARK THOM, MARY NICHOLSON, ROSA CARNEY, AUBREE RUSSELL (collectively "Real Parties" or "Recall Proponents") are the official proponents of the effort to recall Lemon Grove Mayor Alysson Snow, as identified on Exhibits 13, 15 and 17hereto. The Recall Proponents are properly named as Real Parties in Interest herein. Upon information and belief, the Recall Proponents will circulate the Recall Petition among the City's voters, unless this Court directs them not to do so.

27. Petitioner is currently unaware of the true names and capacities of Does 1 through 100, inclusive, and therefore sue those parties by fictitious names. Petitioner is informed and believes that Does 1 through 100, inclusive, are agents of the Recall Proponents and/or otherwise are necessary or indispensable parties to this action, and are responsible in some manner for the conduct described in this pleading.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 28. The wrongful conduct alleged herein occurred in, and continues to occur in, San Diego County, California. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this action, and venue is properly in this Court.
- 29. This Court has personal jurisdiction over Respondent and Defendants the Recall Proponents because Respondent performs his official duties in and each Recall Proponent resides in the City of Lemon Grove, County of San Diego.
- 30. Venue properly lies in this Court because the fraudulent election activities took place in the City of Lemon Grove, County of San Diego and Respondent and Real Parties reside in the City of Lemon Grove, County of San Diego at the commencement of the action. (Code Civ. Proc. § 395, subd. (a).)

SUBSTANTIVE LAW

31. Elections Code section 11020 et seq. governs the recall of local officials, such as Mayor Snow.

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statement of reasons for the proposed recall. (Elec. Code §11020(a)(1).)

33. Elections Code section 11041(a)(2) mandates that the Petition for Local Recall must include "[a] copy of the notice of intention, including the statement of grounds for recall."

Elections Code section 11020 requires that a Notice of Intention must include the

- 34. Only when recall proponents have secured the requisite quantity of signatures on a notice of intention that complies with Elections Code section 11020 et seq., may they then proceed to circulate a Petition for Local Recall. (Elec Code 11020(b)(2).)
- 35. Here, King fraudulently presented the False NOI to the voters of Lemon Grove and then, before submitting the fraudulently obtained signatures to Respondent, replaced the face page with the Fourth NOI.
- 36. The Elections Code does not permit the re-use of signatures from one Notice of Intention on another Notice of Intention, nor does it permit the bait-and-switch scheme used by Real Parties here to present false statements to the voters of Lemon Grove in order to induce their signature on the False NOI, and then swap the face page of the Notice of Intention to avoid challenge under Elections Code section 11042.5.
- 37. Because of the fraudulent nature of the Real Parties' collection of signatures on the Fourth NOI, Real Parties have failed to comply with the mandatory prerequisites of the Elections Code before a Petition for Local Recall may be circulated. Therefore, Petitioner seeks a writ of mandate and injunctive relief prohibiting Real Parties, and their officers, agents, and all persons acting by, through, or in concert with them, from circulating the Third Recall Petition among the City of Lemon Grove's voters, until such time as they have collected the requisite number of signatures on a Notice of Intention to Recall without engaging in a bait-and-switch of the statement of reasons for the recall.
- 38. Respondent has committed an error in violation of the Elections Code by approving the Third Recall Petition, which is premised upon the fraudulently gathered signatures on the False NOI.
- 39. Issuance of a writ of mandate in this action will not substantially interfere with the conduct of an election.

40. Pursuant to Elections Code section 13314, a writ of mandate or injunction should
be issued to Respondent and Real Parties preventing the circulation of the Third Recall Petition
unless and until a Notice of Intention to Recall is signed by the requisite number of voters based
on non-fraudulently gathered signatures.

41. Respondents do not have a constitutional right to falsify election materials. The people have a right to rely on the integrity of the recall process from beginning to end, and safeguards are necessary to prevent abuses and provide for an informed electorate.

PROCEDURAL LAW

Writ of Mandate

- 42. This Petition is brought pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 1085, which provides, in relevant part, that "[a] writ of mandate may be issued by any court to any . . . person, to compel the performance of an act which the law specifically enjoins, as a duty resulting from an office duty or station. . . ."
- 43. Code of Civil Procedure section 1086 provides, in relevant part that "[t]he writ must be issued in all cases where there is not a plain, speedy, and adequate remedy, in the ordinary course of law. It must be issued upon the verified petition of the party beneficially interested."
- 44. Petitioner does not have a plain, speedy or adequate remedy in the ordinary course of law insofar as Real Parties' legally invalid Third Recall Petition is, upon information and belief, about to be printed and circulated among the City's voters, and damages will not be able to compensate Petitioner and the voters, residents and taxpayers of the City for the irreparable harm that Real Parties' legally invalid Third Recall Petition will cause if it is circulated among the City's voters. Accordingly, Petitioner is entitled to a writ of mandate as requested herein.

Injunctive Relief

45. Code of Civil Procedure section 525 provides that "an injunction is a writ or order requiring a person to refrain from a particular act. It may be granted by the court in which the action is brought, or by a judge thereof, and when granted by a judge, it may be enforced as an order of the court."

46.	Code of Civil Procedure section 526 provides that an injunction may be granted
"[w]hen it appear	ars by the complaint that the Petitioner is entitled to the relief demanded, and the
relief, or any p	part thereof, consists in restraining the commission or continuance of the act
complained of,	either for a limited period or perpetually," "[w]hen it appears by the complaint or
affidavits that th	ne commission or continuance of some act during the litigation would produce
. great or irrepa	rable injury, to a party to the action," or "[w]hen it appears, during the litigation,
that a party to th	ne action is doing, or threatens, or is about to do, or is procuring or suffering to be
done, some act	in violation of the rights of another party to the action respecting the subject of
the action, and t	tending to render the judgment ineffectual."

- 47. In the absence of this Court's injunction, Real Parties will cause the legally invalid Third Recall Petition to be printed and circulated among the City's voters, thereby causing Petitioner and others to suffer irreparable harm for which there is no adequate remedy at law.
- 48. Because the Third Recall Petition is legally invalid, Petitioner is entitled to temporary, preliminary and permanent injunctive relief compelling Real Parties not to circulate the Third Recall Petition among the City's voters until such time as they submit a Notice of Intention to Recall that includes the requisite number of signatures obtained *without* fraud.
- 49. Petitioner does not have a plain, speedy or adequate remedy in the ordinary course of law in that no damages or other legal remedy can adequately compensate Petitioner and the residents and taxpayers of the City for the irreparable harm they will suffer as a result of the legally invalid Fourth Recall Petition being circulated among the City's voters. Accordingly, Petitioner is entitled to injunctive relief as requested herein.

CLAIMS FOR RELIEF

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION:

PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDATE

(Against Respondents)

50. Petitioner incorporates by reference paragraphs 1 through 49 of this pleading, as though fully set forth herein.

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51. Based on the foregoing allegations regarding writs of mandate pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure sections 1085, et seq., Petitioner is entitled to a writ of mandate requiring Respondent, Real Parties, and their officers, agents, and all persons acting by, through, or in concert with them, to cease any efforts to collect signatures on the Third Recall Petition unless and until such time as Real Parties submit a Notice of Intention to Recall that includes the requisite number of signatures obtained without fraud.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

(Against Respondents)

- 52. Petitioner incorporates by reference paragraphs 1 through 51 of this pleading, as though fully set forth herein.
- Based on the foregoing allegations, Petitioner is entitled to injunctive relief under 53. Elections Code section 11042.5 and Code of Civil Procedure section 525 et seq. Petitioner is entitled to a temporary restraining order, preliminary injunction, and permanent injunction prohibiting Respondent, Real Parties, and their officers, agents, and all persons acting by, through, or in concert with them, to cease any efforts to collect signatures on the Third Recall Petition unless and until such time as Real Parties submit a Notice of Intention to Recall that includes the requisite number of signatures obtained *without* fraud.
- 54. In summary, Real Parties violated the Elections Code by using the False NOI to secure signatures in support of recall of Mayor Snow, then appending those signatures to the Fourth NOI and submitting it to Respondent. Real Parties have not satisfied the mandatory prerequisites before a recall petition may be circulated under the Elections Code. Accordingly, immediate injunctive relief and declaratory relief as requested in the prayer to this pleading is necessary to prevent irreparable harm to Petitioner and the City's electorate.

INADEQUATE REMEDIES AT LAW

55. Petitioner has no plain, speedy and adequate remedy at law. Without the relief prayed for in this pleading, the rights of the electorate to informed self-government, fair and

equitable expenditures of public funds, and participatory, fair and independent elections, will be defeated.

- 56. Immediate relief is required because, Petitioner is informed and believes, Real Parties will immediately begin gathering signatures on the Third Recall Petition in violation of the requirements of the Elections Code.
- 57. In prosecuting this action, Petitioner is acting on behalf of all City residents, electors and taxpayers interested in informed self-government, fair and equitable expenditures of public funds, participatory, fair and independent elections, and meaningful and full enforcement of the laws that form the bases of this action, and Petitioner seeks enforcement of important rights affecting the public interest.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays for relief as follows:

ON THE FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

- 1. That this Court issue alternative and peremptory writs of mandate requiring Respondent, Real Parties, and their officers, agents, and all persons acting by, through, or in concert with them, immediately to cease any efforts to secure signatures on the Third Recall Petition unless and until such time as Real Parties submit a Notice of Intention to Recall that includes the requisite number of signatures obtained without fraud.
- 2. That this Court issue alternative and peremptory writs of mandate prohibiting Respondent, Real Parties, and their officers, agents, and all persons acting by, through, or in concert with them, from circulating the Third Recall Petition among the City of Lemon Grove's voters, unless and until such time as Real Parties submit a Notice of Intention to Recall that includes the requisite number of signatures obtained without fraud.

ON THE SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

3. That the Court issue immediate relief in the form of a temporary restraining order, preliminary injunction, and permanent injunction prohibiting Respondent, Real Parties, and their officers, agents, and all persons acting by, through, or in concert with them, from circulating the Third Recall Petition among the City of Lemon Grove's voters, unless and until

EXHIBIT A NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CIRCULATE RECALL PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE Alysson Snow: Pursuant to Section 11020, California Elections Code, the undersigned registered qualified voters of Lemon Grove, in the State of California, hereby give notice that we are the proponents of a recall petition and that we intend to seek your recall and removal from the office of Mayor, in Lemon Grove, California, and to demand election of a successor in that office. The grounds for the recall are as follows:

Mayor Alysson Snow betrayed the people of Lemon Grove, putting our community at risk. She misled the Board of Supervisors, falsely claiming we supported a low-barrier homeless encampment near our schools and homes. Snow lied to stakeholders saying the encampment would house families, while in fact, it would house the mentally ill, drug addicted, and petty criminals. This backroom deal brings more homeless individuals to our city without necessary resources, increased sheriff presence, or assurances that Lemon Grove's own homeless will be helped.

Alysson is now reportedly a part of a sprawling federal investigation into corruption in cannable licensing—a serious breach of public trust and further proof she should be recalled. Snow ignores calls for a forensic audit despite an auditor warning of serious accounting errors and potential fraud.

She weaponized law enforcement, having a political opponent arrested at a public meeting. She used racial stereotypes against a community activist, and Snow's husband has harassed dissenters online.



This letter confirms our discussion at City Hall on April 30, 2025 at approximately 3:15 p.m., concerning your Notice of Intention to Recall Mayor Alysson Snow, as well as the letter addressed to you on the same date regarding the Notice of Deficiency and the issues identified in items 1 through 3.

Upon reviewing your submitted documents, it appears you may have gathered the 60 plus required signatures to proceed, excluding approximately 18 lines we identified as having the same handwriting, despite each bearing individual signatures. However, as discussed, I drew your attention to Elections Code Section 9020, which mandates that each petitioner must personally affix the required information. Please be mindful of this statutory requirement as you move forward.

The primary deficiency lies in the omission of the full text of Elections Code Section 11023, which contains the required notice to the officer subject to recall. As advised, due to this material deficiency in your originally submitted Notice of Intention submitted on April 15, 2025 and subsequent second Notice of Intention received on April 29, 2025, I recommended that you thoroughly review the Secretary of State's Guide to Recall Procedures along with the Elections Code. I further suggested that you restart the process by preparing and recirculating a corrected Notice of Intention to Recall Mayor Alysson Snow with new signatures and properly serving both Mayor Snow and myself.

Although there appear to be a sufficient number of signatories, there are several signatories lacking all of the required information. Also, as a reminder: All signatories listed as proponents must be registered voters of the jurisdiction in which the recall is being sought.
- Improper Completion of Petition Fields: Under Elections Code § 9020, each signer of a petition
 must personally affix their own required information. No person other than the signer may enter
 details in the specified columns on their behalf. This requirement must be followed in the Notice
 and any accompanying petition-related materials.
- Required Notice to the Officer: The full text of Elections Code § 11023, which outlines the
 officer's right to respond to the Notice of Intention, must be included in its entirety. Subsection
 (b) of Election Code § 11023 is only partially included in the Notice. The full text of the code
 section must be included.

Please resubmit the Notice of Intention to Recall once these defects have been addressed.

- (3) For a local office where the number of registered voters in the electoral jurisdiction is less than 1,000, the minimum number of proponents listed on the notice of intention is 30.
- (e) The text of Elections Code section 11023, which describes how the officer sought to be recalled may file an answer.

Dear Mr. King:

This letter serves as formal notice that the third Notice of Intention to Recall Mayor Alysson Snow—based on a copy of the original, submitted by you to the City of Lemon Grove has been reviewed and is hereby rejected due to noncompliance with applicable provisions of the California Elections Code and the procedural requirements outlined in the California Secretary of State's Recall Guide for State and Local Officials.

You personally delivered the Notice of Intention to me during the Regular City Council Meeting on May 6, 2025. On May 7, 2025, at approximately 10:00 a.m., you appeared at City Hall and spoke with me directly, and submitted a Proof of Service, indicating service on both Mayor Alysson Snow and myself. At that time, I informed you that based on a prima facie review, your submission appeared to meet the procedural criteria outlined on page 15, items (a) through (e), of the Secretary of State's Recall Guide (Elections Code section 11020). However, upon further indepth review, it has been determined that the filing is deficient.

While the Notice as submitted appears to comply with Elections Code Sections 11020 and 11021 in form, the reuse of previously collected signatures without initiating a new signature collection process renders this filing invalid under the guidance of the Secretary of State.

On May 7, 2025, at approximately 3:25 p.m., you again appeared at City Hall and spoke with me directly. During this conversation, I reiterated my role as Elections Official and that it is the responsibility of the proponent to comply with the procedures outlined in both the California Elections Code and the Secretary of State's Recall Guide. I asked you whether the signatures submitted with the third Notice were newly collected. You confirmed that no new signatures were collected, and that they were reused from a prior, deficient filing.

Based on your confirmation and submission of the Notice of Intention to Recall Mayor Snow it has been determined that your third Notice could not be accepted and is formally rejected.

This determination is supported by the Secretary of State's Recall Guide for Local Officials, Chapter III – Recall of Local Officers, a copy of which is enclosed herewith and which provides the following directive on page 15:

"If a notice of intention is found to be deficient, the proponents will be required to prepare a new notice of intention, including the collection of signatures."

You were provided a printed copy of this page, along with a copy of my April 30, 2025 email sent at 5:06 p.m., for your records during our meeting.

As such, any signatures previously collected under a deficient Notice of Intention cannot be reused. You are required to initiate a new recall process, including the drafting and service of a new Notice of Intention and the collection of new signatures from qualified, registered voters within the City of Lemon Grove.

If you intend to pursue a renewed recall effort, it is your responsibility to ensure strict compliance with Elections Code.

Accordingly, this matter is now closed, and the current recall effort against Mayor Alysson Snow is considered terminated. Any signatures submitted with the third Notice are invalid and may not be used for any future petition.



If you plan to hire paid circulators or form a committee that raises or spends above certain thresholds, you may need to include specific disclosures on your petition and comply with related reporting obligations. It is your responsibility as the proponent to ensure your recall effort meets these requirements.

To ensure compliance with state election laws and to avoid potential legal challenges:

- Please confirm in writing whether you plan to form a committee and/or pay signature gatherers.
- If you will meet the conditions requiring disclosure, please submit a revised petition format that includes the Official Top Funders section.
- If you will not meet these conditions, please confirm in writing your intention to circulate
 the petition without paid signature gatherers and without exceeding \$2,000 in contributions
 or expenditures, and your current petition format will be reviewed under those
 circumstances.

I have completed my review of the proposed Recall Petition form submitted to our office on Tuesday, July 8, 2025. To ensure compliance with the California Elections Code, the following revisions are required:

- Add a period at the end of the phrase "In City of Lemon Grove, California" found in the preamble.
- Remove the phrase "to demand an election of a successor in that office," as this
 language is not permitted for local office recall petitions under the California
 Elections Code Section 11041(b): The petition shall not include a request for a
 successor to be elected or appointed if the officer sought to be recalled is a local
 officer.
- Confirm that 8-point font is used in the signature table where registered voters are to provide their printed name, signature, and address.
- The Notice of Intention to Recall Mayor Alysson Snow was served on June 3, 2025, during a regular City Council meeting. The date of June 5, 2025, reflects when the original documents were submitted to the City Clerk's Office. Please update any references to reflect the correct date of service as June 3, 2025.

Please ensure that all of the above changes are made. The revised petition form must be resubmitted to our office for further review and approval no later than Monday, July 28, 2025.

Additionally, in response to your questions, I contacted the San Diego County Registrar of Voters on July 17, 2025. They confirmed that 11" x 17" paper is acceptable for use in lieu of legal-size paper.

With respect to petition format requirements, the California Secretary of State's Recall Procedures Guide states that each side of a sheet of paper on which signatures appear must include, in no less than 8-point type, the full content required by law (see page 17). Therefore, it is not permissible to include the qualifying content (i.e., notice of intention, statement of reasons, etc.) on one page and

follow with subsequent blank signature pages. Each page on which signatures are collected must include the required content in its entirety.

As part of my review of your submission, I want to remind you that there may be campaign finance requirements or disclosures under state law depending on whether you intend to use paid signature gatherers or unpaid volunteers. If you plan to hire paid circulators or form a committee that raises or spends above certain thresholds, you may need to include specific disclosures on your petition and comply with related reporting obligations. It is your responsibility as the proponent to ensure your recall effort meets these requirements.

To ensure compliance with state election laws and to avoid potential legal challenges:

- Please confirm in writing whether you plan to form a committee and/or pay signature gatherers.
- If you will meet the conditions requiring disclosure, please submit a revised petition format that includes the Official Top Funders section.
- If you will not meet these conditions, please confirm in writing your intention to circulate
 the petition without paid signature gatherers and without exceeding \$2,000 in contributions
 or expenditures, and your current petition format will be reviewed under those
 circumstances.


