<u>Notes</u>

- San Diego State rallied from a 13-point deficit to win. It is the largest deficit overcome for a victory since rallying form 16 down to defeat Pepperdine on 12-6-21.
- San Diego State has won 27 straight games when scoring 65 or more points.
- San Diego State defeats Nevada for the seventh consecutive game.
- The Aztecs defeat Nevada for the 10th straight time at Viejas Arena.
- San Diego State has won 21 consecutive home games when suffering a loss in its previous game (regardless of location).
- San Diego State is 14-1 in its last 15 games immediately following a loss.

Game Notes

- San Diego State defeats Nevada for the 10th straight time at Viejas Arena. SDSU's longest active win streaks in Viejas Arena: Air Force 14, Wyoming 13, Nevada 10, San Jose State 10, UC San Diego 10.
- San Diego State is 26-1 the last 27 times it has led at the half.
- This is the 16th time in the Brian Dutcher era that the Aztecs have won a game with a lower field goal percentage than its opponent.
- San Diego State is 112-8 the last 120 times at home it has shot at least 38.9 percent from the field.
- San Diego State had lost three straight games when its opponent made at least 10 three-point field goals (Nevada had 10 today).
- San Diego State is 75-6 in the Brian Ditcher era when shooting at least 50 percent from the field.

Game Trends

- Nevada's largest lead was 13 points, 18-5 and 22-9, in the first half.
- Nevada made its first six field goal attempts of the game and led 15-5 at the first media time out (15:18). The Wolf Pack was 17-of-46 from the field the rest of the game (37.0 percent).
- San Diego State used a 19-2 run over an 8:48 stretch in the first half to take the lead.
- San Diego State had only one turnover in the second half.
- For the game, the Aztecs were +7 in the turnover category.
- Four different San Diego State players blocked a shot.
- San Diego State won the tip, Mensah tipped to Johnson.

<u>Player Notes</u>

Matt Bradley – game-high 26 points, 5-9 3FGs, team-high 7 rebounds, team-high tying 3 assists, 3 steals, 8 fouls drawn

Posted his second consecutive 20-point scoring game, the 7th of the season and the 30th of his career... Reached double figures for the fifth straight game, the 16th time this season and the 87th time in his career... For the second time this season, the senior has consecutive games with at least 20 points... Last 2 games: 53 points, 11 rebounds, 4 steals, 3 assists and 9-16 3FG (56.3 percent)... He led the team in scoring for the fifth straight game, a team-high 12th time this season... <u>He is just the fourth player in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era to post a game with at least 26 points, seven rebounds, three assists and three steals (also: Jalen McDaniels (1-26-19), Jamaal Franklin (12-30-11) and Brandon Heath (2-24-07)... Now has 1,614 career points... Last 5 games: 22.6 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 1.4 stelas, 0.6 blocked shots, 38-69 FG (55.1 percent), 14-25 3FG (56.0 percent), 23-29 FT (79.3 percent).</u>

Trey Pulliam – 9 points, 3 assists, 1 turnover

The senior score nine points, more than his last three games combined (seven)... He now has 12 assists in his last three games (4.0 apg)... This marked his sixth game this season with one turnover or less (SDSU is 5-1 in those games).

Joshua Tomaic – 8 points, 3-4 FGs, season-high 5 rebounds, 1 blocked shot, 21:13 played, 3 fouls drawn, +12 plus/minus

Produced his highest-scoring game since a nine point performance against UT Arlington (11-20-21)... Had a season-high five rebounds, including two offensive rebounds... Had 12 points in his last six games combined entering today's game... His 21 minutes of playing time were his third-highest total of the season and his most since playing 29 minutes against Cal State Fullerton.

Lamont Butler – 7 points, 2 assists, 1 steal, 3-3 FTs, 4 fouls drawn

Now has scored seven or more points in seven of his last eight games...Has a steal in 13 consecutive games (26 total)... Last 10 games: 9.4 points, 2.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists, 2.1 steals, 12-28 3FG (42.9 percent).

Keshad Johonson – 7 points, 5 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 steal

Continued his strong play of late with seven points and five rebounds. Last 10 games: 7.6 points, 5.8 rebounds, 1.0 apg, 0.7 blocks, 29-58 FGs (50.0 percent).
