San Diego State vs. Colorado State Postgame Notes Moby Arena | Fort Collins, Colo. January 18, 2023

Big Notes

- San Diego State improves to 18-3 in its last 21 games immediately following a loss.
- Nathan Mensah, with two blocked shots in the game, becomes the second Aztec to score at least 800 points, grab at least 70 rebounds and block 200 shots in his career. (also: Leonard Allen (1982-85).)
- San Diego State moves to 22-5 in league road games since the start of the 2019-20 campaign.
- SDSU wins the 14th of its last 16 Mountain West games overall (14-2).
- San Diego State wins its sixth straight road game and is 27-7 in it last 34 road contests.
- SDSU improves to 116-14 under Brian Dutcher when leading at the half.
- SDSU improves to 133-44 (.751) under Brian Dutcher.
- San Diego State moves to 4-0 in true road games and 3-0 in Mountain West road games this season.

Series Notes

- San Diego State improves to 49-43 overall against Colorado State in the all-time series, including a 37-16 mark as Mountain West opponents.
- Since the start of the 2017-18 season, San Diego State is 9-2 against the Rams regardless of location.
- Head Coach Brian Dutcher's record against Colorado State moves to 6-2, including a 4-1 record in Moby Arena.
- The Aztecs have won nine straight games against CSU when the winning margin is by four points of more.
- San Diego State has handed Colorado State three of its last five double digit losses in Moby Arena.

Team Notes

The Aztecs improve to 75-24 in its last 99 games played in January.

- For the 14th time in 18 games this season, the Aztecs held its opponent to 34 or fewer points in the first half.
- San Diego State played its 81st overtime game since the 1971-72 season and is 41-40 in those contests.
- San Diego State improves to 12-1 on the season and 99-11 under Brian Dutcher when outrebounding its opponent. The Aztecs
 have won 49 of their last 51 games when outrebounding their opponent and 66 of its last 69.
- SDSU moves to 68-19 in its last 87 Wednesday games and in the Brian Dutcher era SDSU has won 23 of its last 30 on the day (23-7).
- SDSU assisted on 17 of its 29 made field goals.

Game Flow

- San Diego State won the tip Nathan Mensah to Lamont Butler.
- Nathan Mensah scored the first bucket for the Aztecs, a jumper from the nail at the 19:07 mark.
- After trailing by as many as eight points in the first half, SDSU took its first lead 26-25 on a dunk by Jaedon LeDee at the 4:22 mark.
- All nine Aztecs who appeared in the game also appeared in the scoring column.
- SDSU trailed with five minutes to play, but improved to 4-3 in those games this season.

Player Notes

Micah Parrish — 15 points, 5-of-5 FG, 3-of-3 from 3PT, 5 rebounds, 3 steals

Scored in double figures for the fifth time this season and 38th time of his career... Finished the night a perfect 5-5 from the field and 3-3 from bonus distance... Last time he was perfect from the field was vs. Youngstown State on Jan. 16, 2021 when he was playing at Oakland University (Mich.) ... Tonight was the first time he has gone perfect from behind the arc when attempting at least 3 three-pointers.

Lamont Butler – 19 points, 7-of-14 FG, 2 rebounds, 2 assists, 2 steals

Reached double figure scoring for the sixth time this season and the 18th time in his college career... Has reached double figures scoring for the third time in the last four games... Led the team in scoring for the second time this season and the fourth time in his career.

Darrion Trammell – 11 points, 6 assists, 3 steals

Scored in double figures for the ninth time this season and the 58th time in his career. ... His six assists tie a season-high, he also had six assists in the Aztecs win at Stanford on Nov. 15, 2022.

Matt Bradley - 14 points, 7 assists, 4 rebounds

Scored in double figures for the 11th time this season and 108th time of his career. . . . All 14 points came in the second half and in overtime.
